Narrative history

J25548 Flying Officer (No. 640 Squadron RAF navigator) Frederick Charles Eastley (b.1917) of Regina was KIA 19440809 and is buried at Guemicourt churchyard west of Amiens, Somme, France. Eastley's Halifax was lost during a daylight raid on Les Landesvieilles et Neuves [sic]. He was was the son of Frederick Thomas and Alice Julia (White) Eastley who came from Loddiswell, Devon, England, to homestead NW16-6-5-W3 in the Theresa northeast of Glentworth. Fred Jr. was born on the farm and educated at New Hope, Lafleche and Balfour Tech, Regina. He was working as a bookkeeper for the Wheat Pool when he enlisted at Regina in 1941.


